We recently became aware of a situation where an unauthorized party accessed one of our company's workstations. We discovered this situation on October 7, 2023, and took immediate steps to shut down access to the device. The potential breach includes personally identifiable information (PII) of three Maryland residents. We have no evidence that any of the client's personal information was compromised or misused in any manner.

We recently became aware of a situation where an unauthorized party accessed one of our company's workstations. We discovered this situation on October 7, 2023 and took immediate steps to shut down access to the device. We immediately engaged assistance to help us investigate, evaluate and respond to the situation. Based on the review of the situation and an examination of the impacted computing device, they have indicated that some personal data belonging to you was potentially exposed to the unauthorized intruder. This data may have included personally identifiable information (PII) with some combination of your name, address and social security number.

While we have no evidence that any of your personal information was compromised or misused in any manner, we are taking appropriate precautionary measures to ensure your financial security help alleviate concerns you may have.

What is Legacy CPA Services, PC doing to address this situation?

Legacy CPA Services, PC has made immediate enhancements to our systems, security and practices. Additionally, we have engaged in conducting a full review of our security practices and systems to ensure that enhanced security protocols are in place going forward. We are committed to helping those people who may have been impacted by this unfortunate situation.

In response to the incident, we are providing you with access to **Triple Bureau Credit Monitoring/Triple Bureau Credit Report/Triple Bureau Credit Score** services at no charge. These services provide you with alerts for twelve (12) months from the date of enrollment when changes occur to any of one of your Experian, Equifax or TransUnion credit files. An alert is sent to you the same day that the change or update takes place with the bureau. In addition, we are providing you with proactive fraud assistance to help with any questions that you might have or in event that you become a victim of fraud. These services will be provided by Cyberscout through Identity Force, a TransUnion company specializing in fraud assistance and remediation services.

How do I enroll for the free services?

To enroll in credit monitoring services at no charge, please log on to **URL** and follow the instructions provided. When prompted please provide the following unique code to receive services: **<<Unique Code>>**

In order for you to receive the monitoring services described above, you must enroll within 90 days from the date of this letter. The enrollment requires an internet connection and e-mail account and may not

be available to minors under the age of 18 years of age. Please note that when signing up for monitoring services, you may be asked to verify personal information for your own protection to confirm your identity.

What can I do on my own to address this situation?

If you choose not to enroll in these services, we strongly urge you to do the following:

(Hearing impaired consumers can access their TDD service at 1-877-730-4204.
- **Upon receipt of your credit report**, we recommend that you review it carefully for any suspicious activity.
- Be sure to promptly report any suspicious activity of your account to **Legacy CPA Services, PC.**

While the call center representatives should be able to provide thorough assistance and answer most of your questions, you may still feel the need to speak with Legacy CPA Services, PC regarding this incident. For residents of *Michigan*: It is recommended by state law that you remain vigilant for incidents of fraud and identity theft by reviewing credit card account statements and monitoring your credit report for unauthorized activity.

For residents of all states:

Fraud Alerts: You can place fraud alerts with the three credit bureaus at one of the three major credit bureaus by phone and also via Experian's or Equifax's website. A fraud alert tells creditors to follow certain procedures, including contacting you, before they open any new accounts or change your existing accounts. For that reason, placing a fraud alert can protect you, but also may delay you when you seek to obtain credit. The contact information for all three credit bureaus is below:

Monitoring: You should always remain vigilant and monitor your accounts for suspicious or unusual activity.

Security Freeze: You also have the right to place a security freeze on your credit report at no cost to you. A security freeze is intended to prevent credit, loans and services from being approved in your name without your consent. To place a security freeze on your credit report, you need to make a request to each consumer reporting agency. You may make that request by certified mail, overnight mail, or regular stamped mail, or by following the instructions found at the websites listed below. The following information must be included when requesting a security freeze (note that if you are requesting a credit report for your spouse, this information must be provided for him/her as well): (1) full name, with middle initial and any suffixes; (2) Social Security number; (3) date of birth; (4) current address and any previous addresses for the past five years; and (5) any applicable incident report or complaint with a law enforcement agency or the Registry of Motor Vehicles. The request must also include a copy of a government-issued identification card and a copy of a recent utility bill or bank or insurance statement. It is essential that each copy be legible, display your name and current mailing address, and the date of issue.
