RE: Security Breach Notification

To Whom It May Concern:

We serve as counsel for Zydus Pharmaceuticals (USA) Inc. (“Zydus”), located at 73 Route 31 North, Pennington, NJ 08534. We write to provide notification on behalf of Zydus and its affiliates of a recent data security incident. By providing this notice, Zydus does not waive any rights or defenses under Maryland law, including the data breach notification statute.

On July 28, 2024, Zydus found activity on their computer system that happened without their permission. Zydus immediately began an internal investigation and subsequently brought in third-party specialists to determine the full nature and scope of the incident. This investigation determined that an unauthorized party accessed certain files on Zydus’s network.

Therefore, Zydus conducted a thorough review of the files at issue to determine the type of information contained therein and to whom the information related. Zydus determined the data potentially accessed without authorization included the name of two residents of Maryland in combination with Social Security number.

Zydus notified potentially impacted individuals of this incident via First Class mail on October 29, 2024. Zydus has no reason to believe any information has been misused because of this incident. However, in an abundance of caution, Zydus is offering the potentially impacted residents of Maryland complimentary access to 12 months of credit monitoring and identity protection services.

In response to this incident, Zydus notified law enforcement and implemented additional network security measures. Zydus also continue to review our policies and procedures related to data protection.

Zydus Pharmaceuticals (USA) Inc., on behalf of itself and its affiliates, is writing to notify you of an incident that may affect the privacy of certain information provided to us. We take this incident seriously and are providing you with information about the incident, our response, and steps you can take to help safeguard your information.

On July 28, 2024, we found activity on our computer system that happened without our permission. We immediately began an investigation with the assistance of third-party specialists to determine the full nature and scope of the incident. The investigation determined that an unauthorized party accessed certain files on our network. Therefore, we conducted a thorough review of the files at issue to determine the type of information contained therein and to whom the information related. Our review is now complete and has determined that the potentially impacted information included your name in combination with [REDACTED].

In response to this incident, we notified law enforcement and implemented additional network security measures. We also continue to review our policies and procedures related to data protection. We have no reason to believe any information has been or will be misused because of this incident. However, in an abundance of caution, we are offering you access to twelve months of complimentary credit monitoring and identity protection services.

We encourage you to enroll in the complimentary credit monitoring and identity protection services we are making available to you. Information about how to enroll in these services along with additional resources available to you are included in the attached *Steps You Can Take to Help Protect Your Information*.

We regret any concern this incident may cause you and remind you again that we have no reason to believe any information has been or will be misused. The privacy and security of information is important to us, and we will continue to take steps to protect information in our care.

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STEPS YOU CAN TAKE TO HELP PROTECT YOUR INFORMATION

Enroll in Credit Monitoring / Identity Protection

To enroll in Credit Monitoring services at no charge, please log on to [REDACTED] and follow the instructions provided. When prompted please provide the following unique code to receive services:

In order for you to receive the monitoring services described above, you must enroll within 90 days from the date of this letter. Please note that when signing up for monitoring services, you may be asked to verify personal information for your own protection to confirm your identity.

Once you are enrolled, you will be able to obtain twelve months of unlimited access to your TransUnion credit report and credit score. The daily credit monitoring service will notify you if there are any critical changes to your credit file at TransUnion, including fraud alerts, new inquiries, new accounts, new public records, late payments, change of address and more. The subscription also includes access to identity restoration services that provides assistance in the event your identity is compromised to help you restore your identity and up to \$1,000,000 in identity theft insurance with no deductible. (Policy limitations and exclusions may apply.)

Monitor Your Accounts

We encourage you to remain vigilant against incidents of identity theft and fraud by reviewing your credit reports and account statements for suspicious activity and to detect errors. Under U.S. law, you are entitled to one free credit report annually from each of the three major credit reporting bureaus, TransUnion, Experian, and Equifax. To order your free credit report, visit www.annualcreditreport.com or call 1-877-322-8228. Once you receive your credit report, review it for discrepancies and identify any accounts you did not open or inquiries from creditors that you did not authorize. If you have questions or notice incorrect information, contact the credit reporting bureau.

You have the right to place an initial or extended “fraud alert” on a credit file at no cost. An initial fraud alert is a one-year alert that is placed on a consumer’s credit file. Upon seeing a fraud alert, a business is required to take steps to verify the consumer’s identity before extending new credit. If you are a victim of identity theft, you are entitled to an extended fraud alert lasting seven years. Should you wish to place a fraud alert, please contact any of the three credit reporting bureaus listed below.

As an alternative to a fraud alert, you have the right to place a “credit freeze” on a credit report, which will prohibit a credit bureau from releasing information in the credit report without your express authorization. The credit freeze is designed to prevent credit, loans, and services from being approved in your name without your consent. However, you should be aware that using a credit freeze may delay, interfere with, or prohibit the timely approval of any subsequent request or application you make regarding a new loan, credit, mortgage, or any other account involving the extension of credit. Pursuant to federal law, you cannot be charged to place or lift a credit freeze on your credit report. To request a credit freeze, you will need to provide the following information:

1. Full name (including middle initial as well as Jr., Sr., III, etc.);
2. Social Security number;
3. Date of birth;
4. Address for the prior two to five years;
5. Proof of current address, such as a current utility or telephone bill;
6. A legible photocopy of a government-issued identification card (e.g., state driver’s license or identification card); and
7. A copy of either the police report, investigative report, or complaint to a law enforcement agency concerning identity theft, if you are a victim of identity theft.

You have the right to file a police report if you ever experience identity theft or fraud. Please note that in order to file a report with law enforcement for identity theft, you will likely need to provide some proof that you have been a victim. Instances of known or suspected identity theft should also be reported to law enforcement, your state Attorney General, and the FTC. This notice has not been delayed by law enforcement.
