RE: Data Breach Notification

To Whom It May Concern:

We serve as counsel for Standard Calibrations, Inc. ("SCI") located at 501 Resource Row, Chesapeake, VA 23320. We write to provide notification of a recent data breach. By providing this notice, SCI does not waive any rights or defenses under Maryland law, including the data breach notification statute.

On December 1, 2024, SCI discovered unusual activity on its network and immediately began an investigation, which included working with third-party specialists. SCI's investigation determined there was unauthorized access to a portion of its network between November 30, 2024, and December 1, 2024. Thereafter, SCI conducted a review of the portion of its network impacted in order to determine the information contained therein and to whom it related.

On February 7, 2025, SCI completed its review and determined the type of information identified in its review may have included individual's first and last name in combination with a Social Security number. On February 7, 2025, SCI identified, for the first time, approximately one Maryland resident who may have been impacted by this incident.

In response to this incident, SCI conducted an investigation, reviewed its policies and procedures related to data protection, and notified federal law enforcement. Additionally, SCI began providing notice to the potentially impacted individuals on February 20, 2025, via U.S. mail. A copy of the notice is attached as Exhibit A. In an abundance of caution, SCI is offering the potentially impacted individuals 12 months of complimentary credit monitoring and identity protection services.

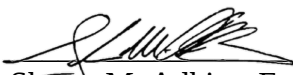

We are writing to inform you of a cyber security event experienced by Standard Calibrations, Inc. ("SCI") that may have involved your information described below. While we have no evidence of attempted or actual misuse of any information, we are providing you with information about the incident, our response, and steps you can take to help protect your information, should you feel it appropriate to do so.

What Happened: On December 1, 2024, we discovered unusual activity on our network and immediately began an investigation, which included working with third-party specialists. Our investigation determined there was unauthorized access to a portion of our network between November 30, 2024, and December 1, 2024. Thereafter, we conducted a review of the portion of our network impacted in order to determine the information contained therein and to whom it related.

What Information Was Involved: On February 7, 2025, we completed our review and address verification process. The type of information identified in our review included your first and last name together with [REDACTED].

What We Are Doing: Upon discovery, we engaged third-party forensic specialists to investigate this matter, reviewed our policies and procedures related to data protection, and notified federal law enforcement. Out of an abundance of caution, we have arranged for you to activate, at no cost to you, an online credit monitoring service for twelve (12) months provided by Cyberscout, a TransUnion company specializing in fraud assistance and remediation services. Due to privacy laws, we cannot activate these services for you directly. Additional information regarding how to activate the complimentary credit monitoring service is enclosed. We have also provided additional information about steps you can take to help protect yourself against fraud and identity theft.

What You Can Do: We recommend that you remain vigilant in regularly reviewing and monitoring all of your account statements and credit history to guard against any unauthorized transactions or activity. If you discover any suspicious or unusual activity on your accounts, please promptly contact your financial institution or company. Additionally, you can enroll to receive the complimentary credit monitoring services we are making available to you. You can also review the enclosed "Steps You Can Take to Help Protect Your Information" for additional resources.

STEPS YOU CAN TAKE TO HELP PROTECT YOUR INFORMATION

Enroll in Credit Monitoring / Identity Protection

In response to the incident, we are providing you with access to **Single Bureau Credit Monitoring/Single Bureau Credit Report/Single Bureau Credit Score** services at no charge. These services provide you with alerts for twelve (12) months from the date of enrollment when changes occur to your credit file. This notification is sent to you the same day that the change or update takes place with the bureau. Finally, we are providing you with proactive fraud assistance to help with any questions that you might have or in event that you become a victim of fraud. These services will be provided by Cyberscout, a TransUnion company specializing in fraud assistance and remediation services.



To enroll in Credit Monitoring services at no charge, please log on to <https://bfs.cyberscout.com/activate> and follow the instructions provided. When prompted please provide the following unique code to receive services: .

In order for you to receive the monitoring services described above, you must enroll within 90 days from the date of this letter. The enrollment requires an internet connection and e-mail account and may not be available to minors under the age of 18 years of age. Please note that when signing up for monitoring services, you may be asked to verify personal information for your own protection to confirm your identity.

Monitor Your Accounts

We encourage you to remain vigilant against incidents of identity theft and fraud by reviewing your credit reports/account statements for suspicious activity and to detect errors. Under U.S. law, you are entitled to one free credit report annually from each of the three major credit reporting bureaus, TransUnion, Experian, and Equifax. To order your free credit report, visit www.annualcreditreport.com or call 1-877-322-8228. Once you receive your credit report, review it for discrepancies and identify any accounts you did not open or inquiries from creditors that you did not authorize. If you have questions or notice incorrect information, contact the credit reporting bureau.

You have the right to place an initial or extended “fraud alert” on a credit file at no cost. An initial fraud alert is a one-year alert that is placed on a consumer’s credit file. Upon seeing a fraud alert, a business is required to take steps to verify the consumer’s identity before extending new credit. If you are a victim of identity theft, you are entitled to an extended fraud alert lasting seven years. Should you wish to place a fraud alert, please contact any of the three credit reporting bureaus listed below.

As an alternative to a fraud alert, you have the right to place a “credit freeze” on a credit report, which will prohibit a credit bureau from releasing information in the credit report without your express authorization. The credit freeze is designed to prevent credit, loans, and services from being approved in your name without your consent. However, you should be aware that using a credit freeze may delay, interfere with, or prohibit the timely approval of any subsequent request or application you make regarding a new loan, credit, mortgage, or any other account involving the extension of credit. Pursuant to federal law, you cannot be charged to place or lift a credit freeze on your credit report. To request a credit freeze, you will need to provide the following information:

1. Full name (including middle initial as well as Jr., Sr., III, etc.);
2. Social Security number;
3. Date of birth;
4. Address for the prior two to five years;
5. Proof of current address, such as a current utility or telephone bill;
6. A legible photocopy of a government-issued identification card (e.g., state driver’s license or identification card); and
7. A copy of either the police report, investigative report, or complaint to a law enforcement agency concerning identity theft, if you are a victim of identity theft.

Additional Information

You can further educate yourself regarding identity theft, fraud alerts, credit freezes, and the steps you can take to protect your personal information by contacting the credit reporting bureaus, the Federal Trade Commission (FTC), or your state Attorney General. The FTC also encourages those who discover that their information has been misused to file a complaint with them. You have the right to file a police report if you ever experience identity theft or fraud. Please note that in order to file a report with law enforcement for identity theft, you will likely need to provide some proof that you have been a victim. Instances of known or suspected identity theft should also be reported to law enforcement, your state Attorney General, and the FTC. This notice has not been delayed by law enforcement.
